President's Message The first major topic for December is the new look at the cemetery. If you have driven by on North Augusta Street, you know that the hedge that defined the area has been removed as it had become a mass of weeds and poison ivy. The trustees have since been working on a plan for a replacement. They have decided on a galvanized wrought iron fence with piers (posts) that will hold commemorative plaques. I have seen samples of the fencing material which is sturdy and handsome. Once in place, the fence will enhance the North Augusta area. Getting the details settled will take a while, but by this time next year, the cemetery will be defined by a new fence. It will be worth the wait.

The money for this project comes from a separate cemetery fund. You will have an opportunity to defray some of the cos t by purchasing a plaque at a later time.

On December 4 there is a memorial service for Susan Webb at 5 pm followed by a meal. The regular religious service begins at 7:30 with the oneg provided by Susan's daughter, new member Nadia Webb.

We have **a Chanukah party and silent auction on Saturday, December 12 at 6:00 pm**. The auction will be assembled and displayed by Ken and Elizabeth Schwartz and set up, ready for bidding when you arrive. All money collected goes to the Women's Group projects. There are gift baskets, restaurant gift cards, certificates for various services, artwork and accessories. Come, see and bid, please. And eat! Beginning with an oh- so- brief Havdalah service and menorah lightings (**bring your menorahs!**), the meal will begin at 6:30. Please bring a dairy dish to share. People with last names beginning C-D should bring a dessert. We will eat like meatless kings!

Again this year we will be providing dinner to the Free Clinic staff. And again this year the temple will provide the food and serve a meal on December 24 at the Valley Mission on West Beverley Street. Eric Stamer Catering makes it happen by preparing and transporting everything for us. Please volunteer to provide one or more of the items on the list – itemized on page 3 under Things of Note.

From the Rabbi's Desk Dear Temple House of Israel Congregants and Friends,


