From the Rabbi's Desk

Dear Temple House of Israel Congregants and Friends,

The past month has been a blur with all that was happening. Other than the spate of holidays, the most noticeable thing was the sudden cold snap, then return to warm weather; now we are truly in the Fall season. School is in full swing. The leaves have changed, and many have already fallen. Many of us are thinking ahead, anticipating the Thanksgiving holidays. The next Jewish Holiday (other than Shabbat) will be Chanukah. It is supposed to be a quieter time on the congregational calendar, but so much is still in progress that it doesn't feel that wayl.

As I write this, we are coming up on the **Fall Community Awareness Shabbat service**, which will be **October 30, 2015**. Please invite any friends, neighbors, co-workers, teachers, or anyone else that has expressed any curiosity or interest in what Jewish services are like to join us to observe. We will insert some explanations as we go, offer an opportunity for questions afterwards, and invite our guests to come and 'meet' the Torah – to see it and talk about how it is made, as well as welcome all who are present to join us for the Oneg Shabbat. For anyone who is unable to join us for this event, please let them know that we will repeat it in the Spring at the February 19th service, so they can plan ahead.

From the Rabbi's Desk (con't)

The *Free* **Introduction to Hebrew** five-session course will begin on November 8th at 3 pm at Temple House of Israel. The sessions are scheduled for 3-6 pm on November 8, 15, 22, December 6 and 13 (no class the weekend of Thanksgiving). This class is open to anyone (congregant or not, Jewish or not) who wishes to learn the Hebrew Alphabet and vowels, begin to build a small vocabulary, and pick up some simple grammatical rules. Those who have taken the course before are welcome to do so again. The goal is that those taking the class will be able to decode - sound out - any Hebrew, and will begin to know some words or phrases that appear often in liturgy. Please pass this along to others who may be interested so they can join this class. No need to register ahead of time, just come to the first session.

See the flyer included with this bulletin which describes the **Kulanu** program on November 1st, at 3 pm, co-sponsored by Beth El Congregation and the JMU Hillel. Kulanu is an organization that seeks to support emerging Jewish communities in (usually) remote areas. The speaker at this event will be Modrek Maerersera, a member and leader in the Lemba Jewish community in Zimbabwe. He will discuss his own experience, the community, and life as a Jew in that region. I am sure it will be most interesting, as have been other Kulanu programs in the past.

Another program entitled **When a Loved One Dies: the Chevrah Kadisha and other Jewish Burial Practices,** is also taking place on November 1st. I want to share this one with you in particular, as this topic is near to my heart. I would be delighted to see you there. Author Michelle Brafman and I will discuss Jewish burial and mourning practices and related spiritual teachings at 7 pm Sunday, November 1st in Omansky Hall at Congregation Beth Israel (301 E. Jefferson Street). The work of a fictional Jewish volunteer burial society (Chevrah Kadisha) is an important plot element in Michelle's new novel *Washing the Dead*. There will be a question and answer period afterwards and Michelle will be available to sign copies of her book. Light refreshments will be served. RSVP to office@cbicville.org or 434-295-6382.

November 21st at 6:30 pm there is a Havdalah and Discussion program at Temple House of Israel. We will begin with Havdalah (5:42 pm that evening), and then enjoy some light refreshments, a brief presentation to outline the topic, and a conversation with all present. My guest that evening is Rev. Paul Oakley of the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Waynesboro (some of you may have met him during High Holidday services this year). The topic of the discussion will be announced, but this is expected to be an informal conversation more than a presentation. I had several very pleasant conversations with Rev. Oakley, and I am looking forward to the chance to engage with him in a larger group.

The Torah Parashiot for the coming weeks are Vayera, Chayei Sarah, Toldot, Vayeitzei, Vayishlach, Vayeshev, Miketz, Vayigash. Rosh Chodesh Kislev will be on November 12th.
