	and the final Pulpit Exchange with Rev. Greg Hollis-Dodge. The Torah Parashiot for the coming weeks are Tzav, Shemini (Shabbat Parah), Tazria (Shabbat						
Torah	HaChodesh), Metzora (Shabbat Hagadol), Pesach Day 1 and Pesach Day 8. We are in year 3 of the triennial cycle (the third or last part of the cycle of Torah readings). Rosh Chodesh for Nisan is April 9 th . Ta'anit Bechorim (Fast of the First Born, sometimes called Ta'anit Bechorot) is observed by only a small segment of the Jewish population – first born males – on April 22 nd from sunrise to sundown in commemoration of being spared from the death of the firstborn as the tenth plague. The Sefirat HaOmer (Counting of the Omer) begins on the second night of Passover and goes until Erev Shavuot, this years from sundown April 23 rd until June 11 th sundown, marking the time between Redemption and Revelation, from Yetziat Mitzrayim (going out from Egypt) to the encounter with the Divine at Sinai.						
Rabbi's Message	For me, Pesach is a very special part of the cycle of the year. It marks the start of our calendar, with redemption and liberation from slavery, a rescue from an oppressive and intolerable situation. It tells the story of the rescue and formation of the Hebrew slaves through shared experience, time together, and the forging of mutual strength, into a nation of people that became the Israelites. It offers the opportunity to 'walk with G-d' and immerse in G-d's creation in the form of nature, and even to approach and experience the divine on both a personal and collective level. It serves as our formative story, offering us an origin and a common narrative, and allows us to forge a collective past, a shared vision, a mutual future, and a sense of meaning. May this Passover be a time for you and yours to experience all of these aspects, and may this be a zissen (sweet) time for you. Chag Pesach Sameeach (Happy Passover holiday). Rabbi Joe Blair
