Rabbi's Message	This month I had something I have known for a long time called more sharply into focus. I want to share with you what I was reminded about recently, because it is about you (collectively). A great deal of what I do is not 'public'. It includes conversations, visits, meetings, and appointments with people, often one on one. As I go about these activities, speaking to congregants and others in the larger community, I am allowed and invited to share in and hear about the events in many people's lives. Obviously, sharing in joys and simchas is a pleasure and celebrating moments of nachas with families is a source of happiness.				
	On the other hand, hearing about the troubles and worries and tsuris that afflict those in our community might be thought to be a weight and a source of distress, and to a degree it is, because I care about and empathize with these people. At the same time, I was reminded again as I spoke to someone, these difficulties and events offer a source of uplift: clearly, not the difficulties themselves, but the responses of those with whom I speak to those challenges.				
	I am constantly buoyed and energized by the opportunity to see the strength, courage, fortitude and energy with which people I meet are able to face things that seem so heavy to hear, let alone experience. I am often amazed, and always feel honored to be allowed this privilege of seeing these people, our community members and friends, at very vulnerable times, and yet watching them acting and choosing hope and courage, and living meaningfully and in relationship with others through it all. I don't think they (read you) know just how incredibly amazing they (you) are. Knowing the little I do of these circumstances, and seeing how they (you) carry on is inspiring, and fills me with admiration and awe.				
	May they, and we, continue in this fashion, and move, as we recite at the end of each book of the Torah, "Chazak, Chazak, veNitchazaik" – from strength to strength, we will be strength- ened. With this strength, may we face the obstacles that we encounter, and continue to live meaningful lives, as fully as we can, striving to be our highest selves and making the world better for our having been in it.

Self-styled "realists" equate morality with expediency. We will examine the phenomenon of morality: its origin and development, how we arrive at our personal morality, why systems of morality may be immoral, and whether the universe implies or supports any particular ethical stance.
