## Rabbi's Message

The last month was busy, and there has been a lot happening in the congregation, including changes that were (to me, at least) unexpected and unforeseen. At the same time there has been almost too much to absorb occurring in the larger world. All of which leaves me, and I suspect many of us, breathless, unsure, anxious, and even worried. I don't know what all the changes and events portend; I hope good things can come of at least some of them, but it is hard to see or feel that right now. I don't have answers (nor do I think anyone does), and I don't believe in such a thing as a panacea or cure-all, but I know that we cannot act out of fear or in anger and expect positive results.

I believe that this is precisely when it is essential that we look to the members of our community and seek solace and comfort, both in each other, in our sacred texts, in our holy rituals and in the words of our beloved prayers. That won't make it "all better" for us, but it may help us to dig deeper and find courage, moral strength and compassion – all of which are deeply needed at this time in many areas by so many people. Perhaps we will find it in ourselves to work for the good and find the holy sparks that are hidden, even in the most difficult situations and people – and see a way to elevate those sparks.
