### From the Rabbi

#### A Word ... or More "From Temple to Synagogue to Congregation: A thought for the Month of Tishri, even Beyond"

It's no coincidence that our Holydays and the Festival of Succot, concluding with Shemini Atzeret, are clumped together from the first through the twenty-second of Tishri. When you realize that on Shemini Atzeret there is a prayer for rain you'll understand why. Today it isn't difficult to travel to Jerusalem and back home regardless where in Israel you live. It might be a relatively long trek but there are modern highways and paved roads. Not so in the days of our biblical ancestors when the rainy season made such travel virtually impossible.

We read that on Shemini Atzeret King Solomon sent the people to their homes following the dedication of the Temple. It wasn't until the following Passover, approximately six months, that offerings at the Temple were required. Following its destruction the synagogue replaced the Second Temple (thank God!), and prayer, study and deeds of lovingkindness replaced sacrifices (an even greater thanks). You didn't need to concern yourself as much about weather; the synagogue was local.

All the above was a brief lesson about the season in which we find ourselves today, but there is more...

About forty years ago my Wilmington synagogue changed its name from Temple Beth Emeth to Congregation Beth Emeth, not because of the (Orthodox) position that synagogues couldn't call themselves "Temple", but because we felt the emphasis had to be on the PEOPLE not the BUILDING. There is so much more to a congregation than there was to the Jerusalem Temples. As a sentence in virtually all of our Reform prayerbooks reminds us,

The synagogue is the sanctuary of Israel. Born out of our longing for the living God, it has been to Israel, throughout our wanderings, a visible token of the presence of God in our people's midst. Its beauty is the beauty of holiness;

steadfast it has stood as the champion of justice, mercy, and peace. To achieve this you need PEOPLE. Interestingly, there are congregations without walls, far more today than in the past, but you'll never find a building without people that is alive and thriving! We have a beautiful sanctuary and a caring and committed congregation,. Let's keep it that way for a long, long time....even if it is called "Temple" House of Israel.

### High Holy Days

Introducing **Cantor Michael M. Mandel**, who was ordained as Cantor, and received a Masters in Sacred Music degree from the Hebrew Union College—Jewish Institute of Religion's School of Sacred Music in 1997.

A native of Havana, Cuba, Cantor Mandel taught Spanish, Hebrew and French for many years in Washington DC where he sang with the Washington National Opera Chorus before deciding to pursue the cantorate as a career.

Cantor Mandel has sung in many congregations around the world, including in Lyon, France, San Juan, Puerto Rico and in Havana, Cuba. He has served as Cantor at Temple Menorah in Redondo Beach, California and was asked by Rabbi Grumbacher to come to Congregation Beth Emeth in Wilmington, Delaware.

Following his four years in Wilmington he served as High Holyday Cantor at Sixth and I Synagogue in Washington DC, Bucknell University in PA, Knoxville, TN and Lewes, DE. In 2013, he founded Mizmor, an a cappella group specializing in Jewish choral music.
