A Word ... or More "Why God Created Jewish Funeral Directors"

From the Rabbi

This is one of the years in which all the Fall holydays and holidays occur only in September, only bordering on our beautiful Autumn season. We'd be tempted to have said, "Well, the holydays came early this year," but what we know is that the holydays are never early or late; they begin on "the first day of the seventh month" (Tishrei) regardless what the Gregorian calendar says.

The Jewish calendar is lunar/solar. There is only the space of a few weeks in which our holidays can occur, as opposed to Islam's lunar-only calendar. Ramadan, for example, can occur in just about any month of the year.

I'm not going to get into the complex nature of our calendar. I've always told the students in the conversion classes, "God created funeral directors to make available our Jewish calendar every year!" Samson Raphael Hirsch, the Father of modern Orthodox Judaism, said, "Our calendar is the catechism of the Jews." Other faiths have a catechism of beliefs, but our days of celebration spell out the values we hold dear, and their connection to God. We have our High Holydays stressing our personal responsibilities; the Festivals of Succot, Pesach and Shavuot giving thanks for the various harvests as well as their connection to the Exodus and our wilderness wandering; and Holidays such as Chanukah and Purim which highlight "historical" events.

It's not too late to find a Hebrew calendar probably online. I suggest you build your Jewish life around that. It includes secuar holidays we well, but it gives you the opportunity to know what special days are approaching and to check out the opportunities for celebration
