A Word ... or More "Plethora"

From the Rabbi

Just before the funeral service for her husband began, a woman was approached by someone who asked her, "May I say a word?" She replied, "Of course," and with that the man approached the lectern and said "Plethora," and that was his word. As he passed her on his way back to his seat, she said, "Thank you, that means a lot to me."

Some people don't laugh while others tell me they will repeat it over and over. And on occasion someone will call or email me later, sometimes laughing as they speak, telling me they googled the word "plethora" finding out it, in fact, means "a lot."

February's Torah portions contain a plethora of minutiae. After five months of wonderful stories beginning as we start Genesis and ending in the revelation at Sinai, one reads Torah, mitzvoth, chukim and mishpatim, "In many respects all those words are synonyms for the do's and don'ts for which our tradition is famous. Some are well-known and others are truly in the treasure trove of legal details of which we have a plethora not only in the portions we begin in February but in post-biblical Judaism as well.

As we approach Valentine's Day, the love-themed holiday, we remember that Christianity's Paul said that Judaism was a religion of law while his was a religion of love. Well, what he said was not true. God showed Divine love through those very laws of which Paul spoke. You cannot have a viable society without a system to keep people and institutions in line. That's the important point the plethora of Torah, mitzvoth, chukim and mishpatim make. It's all in the details that teach as much as does the lore we've been reading until now.

Congregant's Capsule

Benn Legum and Penelope Ferguson's story

Benn was born and raised in Williamsburg, VA, where his parents were one of the three founding families of Temple Beth El, a conservative synagogue there. Benn and Penelope maintain a membership there to carry on the family tradition.

Staunton became Benn's home after graduating from the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy in 1980. He worked for Waynesboro Community Hospital as a Pharmacist before starting Home I.V. Care and Nutritional Services. Thereafter he joined Temple House of Israel and has been a member since then. He has volunteered twice with Sar EL through *Volunteers for Israel* and both times spent two weeks with the Israeli Defense Forces.

Benn earned his Doctor of Pharmacy at the University of Florida. His thesis focused on the benefits of setting up clinics in Ethiopia to combat the spread of tuberculosis so the Ethiopian Jews who had not emigrated to Israel would have care. His day job is as a Clinical Pharmacist with Valley Health. He has served on the Augusta Regional Free Clinic board and as their Clinic Charge Pharmacist for 24 years. He also served on the boards of Stuart Hall and Augusta Health's Hospice.

Penelope Ferguson first moved to Staunton in 1994 and renovated a home here. She moved to Harrisonburg for about 10 years before returning to Staunton to be with Benn, renovating their home here.

She is a retired Registered Dietitian, having worked Critical Care, Behavioral Health and Support Nutrition. She also worked for a company as a consultant dietitian, where she first met Benn.

Penelope is a board member of the Alleghany Mountain Institute, volunteers with AMI, and teaches health topics with the Valley Program for Aging Services. She enjoys cooking and is a published author of articles on cooking and nutrition.

Penelope and Benn were married by Rabbi David Katz on February 14, 2018 at Temple Beth El in Williamsburg, in the sanctuary named in honor of Benn's father. They have made THOI the focus of their religious life. They enjoy renovating and construction projects around their home, traveling and enjoying their togetherness.
